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Letter from Father Trowbridge

It was reported in a recent article in the Northwest Herald that she "was removed from the courtroom during a sentencing hearing last month after a court security officer saw her raise her middle finger in the direction of [her sister]."

Both Mrs. Strong and I are abundantly aware that this action was wrong. Theresa knows this action was wrong. The nature of this action is not grounds for her termination; however, it is one

which both the Principal and myself have followed up with in a direct, precise and professional manner.

Mrs. Tapley is a devoted teacher and a woman of faith who provides a safe and articulate environment of learning and scientific exploration. I consider her presence with us a blessing and an asset to our academic integrity.

Any concerns which are expressed to me are taken seriously. Know of my prayers for your family and your intentions.

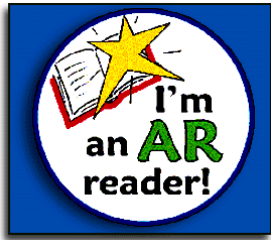
