From the principal...

Dear Parents and Families,

It has been another great week at SS. Peter and Paul! Although it was very wet and dark outside, inside the building our attitudes were joyful and the learning was plentiful! We had a successful picture day today and students were all dressed to impress! Reminder that this coming Wednesday is an early dismissal day. Students will be dismissed at 11:15.

Throughout this week's morning announcements, Mrs. Strong and I have been talking with students about the Cardinal Virtue of Justice. The Catechism of The Catholic Church states justice is the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to give their due to God and neighbor. Justice toward God is called the "virtue of religion." Justice toward men disposes one to respect the rights of each and to establish in human relationships the harmony that promotes equity with regard to persons and to the common good.

My reflection today was about September 11th. As a middle school student during this time I have very vivid memories of the day and the weeks following. While I have very strong memories of the tragedy, pain, and confusion, I also have strong memories of the heroes, the fire fighters, EMTs, and leaders of our country who worked for the common good. At the same time, there were many day-to-day heroes who had a great impact on me and other students during this crisis. As Fred Rogers famously said "look for the helpers". The teachers, coaches, parents, and family members who worked to make life as normal as possible for us kids. As we work this year to create a safe school environment during this time of national emergency, never forget that every day heroism and courage makes a difference to each of our students.
