Dear Parents and Families,

We continue to celebrate all of our SSPP community and the hard work everyone is putting into serving our children!



Throughout this week in our morning announcements, Mrs. Strong and I have been talking with students about the Cardinal Virtue of Fortitude. *Fortitude* is the moral virtue that ensures firmness in difficulties and constancy in the pursuit of the good. It strengthens the resolve to resist temptations and to overcome obstacles in the moral life. The virtue of fortitude enables one to conquer fear, even fear of death, and to face trials and persecutions. It disposes one even to renounce and sacrifice his life in defense of a just cause. "The Lord is my strength and my song."<sup>70</sup> "In the world you have tribulation; but because of good cheer, I have overcome the world.

How can we instill a sense of fortitude in our own children? While there are many large acts of fortitude to share and reflect on with our students. I think it can come from celebration of small acts of courage. As we spoke about with our students this week, sometimes just a kind word, a tiny moment of giving, or a small act of kindness in a difficult situation can have a great ripple effect on the world around us! A great question for your student is, "How were you brave for others today?"
